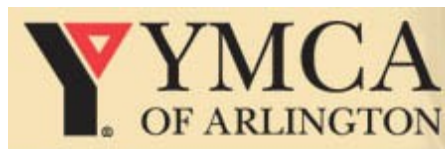


## 21st Century SUMMER CAMPS
