This RFP is evaluated based on the mark-up/down (+/-) to the OPIS (Oil Price Information Service) rack average for Pad 3, the designated geographic area for Arlington. By using this method of pricing, the District can monitor the price charged based on an industry standard. Vendor pump charges and other fees were used in the evaluation to calculate the lowest price to provide the best value to the District.

Section 44.031 of the education code exempts the purchase of vehicle fuel from competitive bidding. However, it is in the best interest of the District to bid vehicle fuel since fuel distributors are willing to compete for business based on the mark-up/down from the OPIS rack average.

It is recommended that the low bid meeting specifications and providing the best value to the District be awarded the contract.

Initially, grant funds will be budgeted to provide professional development related to trauma among school age children, physical education supplies for a well-rounded education, and supplemental supplies and materials that engage students in rigorous, relevant, and integrated learning experiences focused on International Baccalaureate/ Advanced Placement programs. The grant budget may be amended to address school safety and student wellness as needs are identified and prioritized during the year.

DISCUSSION:

A. 2014 Bond Program Update

Mrs. Powell shared an overview on the status of the 2014 Bond Program projects. Of the \$663 million, \$433,999,462 has been expended and another \$80,895,963 encumbered. Orders have been issued for fine arts instruments and equipment being purchased in the fourth year of the program. A Steinway Spirio Grand Piano for the fine arts center was donated by the Dan and Linda Dipert family. Technology projects include expanding the number and scope of security cameras in all schools, implementing standard classroom technology packages across the district and enhancing the network infrastructure. Year four purchases for transportation include twenty buses and replacements for twenty-five white fleet vehicles. There are 101 construction projects in various stages of work from design to closeout. Thirty-five projects are currently under construction and staff is working to prepare for campus operations to resume mid-August. Through the school year, ongoing construction projects are coordinated with campus principals. Mrs. Powell shared progress information and pictures of facility renovation projects, new construction projects and deficiency upgrade projects at various locations. She reported that Tier II HUB participation commitment was 24.80% and actual achieved through June 2018 was 17.35%. Mrs. Powell also shared pictures of the fine arts center and athletics complex architectural renderings showing the planned interior designs.

Board members asked questions regarding the consolidation of printers at campuses for cost efficiencies, the communication strategies planned for schools with construction projects during registration, and construction projects that will necessitate temporarily moving classes to alternate classrooms.

OPEN FORUM FOR NON-AGENDA ITEMS: None

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT:

Superintendent Cavazos reported that the 2017-2018 school year ended with six amazing graduations for the traditional campuses at UTA's College Park Center. Dr. Cavazos shared that he is always inspired by the graduating students and proud that they are ready to pursue their dreams. More than 4,000 students graduated with the Class of 2018, and summer school graduation is August 7, 2018.

The AISD extended year special needs students were very festive as they participated in the annual Fourth of July parade at Burgin Elementary. They had matching tie-dye t-shirts and signs to hold as they paraded through the halls for parents, teachers and fellow EY students at Burgin.

The AISD was very well represented at the Arlington Fourth of July Parade. Marching bands, color guards, drill teams, cheerleaders and more from all of the traditional high schools participated, as did some of our board members and Dr. Cavazos.

Monday, July 23, 2018 was a special signing day ceremony as four former AISD students, and eighteen current students, signed with Lockheed Martin at the company's High School Intern Signing Day. The four former students signed post-college graduation job offers after being a part of the inaugural Lockheed Martin internship group. The eighteen current students are a part of the newest class of forty-seven interns from the Arlington ISD, Crowley ISD, Fort Worth ISD and Keller ISD.

AISD principals, assistant principals and deans went through two days of Instructional Leadership Academy last week at the PDC. They learned how to create a ripple effect on their campus this year, and their excitement for what they learned will carry over to their respective staffs. Dr. Cavazos thanked them all for their commitment to a positive culture that promotes continuous improvement by all

Dr. Cavazos took a moment to recognize someone who has probably seen and been a part of more board meetings than anyone in AISD history. He shared that Spence hit a milestone of 20 years of covering Arlington ISD board meetings in some form, and he deserves a big congratulations. Even though Spence prefers to be behind the scenes, Dr. Cavazos wanted to make sure that we thanked him for his commitment and all that he does for the district.

ACTION:

A. Consider Ordinance #138 – Setting the 2018 Tax Rate

Chief Academic Officer Cindy Powell reported that the Board passed the budget in June, as required by law. Certified property values were not available at that time so tonight the process is completed. On June 5, 2018 the Board approved the proposed rate of \$1.36867 to include in the "Notice of Public Meeting to Discuss Budget and Proposed Tax Rate." The proposed maintenance and operation rate is \$1.04000 and a debt service tax rate of \$0.32867 generates the revenue necessary to service the 2018-19 bonded debt payments. Administration recommended no change from the 2017 rate. Mrs. Powell reported that while the rate is staying the same, the property values increased so the tax revenue realized will increase. Due to the increase in property values, Section 26.05(b) of the Texas Property Code requires that the motion language state the increase.

Board Finance and Academics Committee Chair John Hibbs noted that the tax rate of \$1.36867 is the same as last year even though the required motion language can be confusing. As property values increase that equates to an increase in funds the district will receive in property taxes. The funds received from the state, however, will decrease as the funds from property taxes increase. Mr. Hibbs wanted to clarify so that there was no illusion that the district will receive more. He shared that citizens are going to see that the effective tax rate is the same as last year and that the increase is due to a change in property values, not a change in tax rate.

Motion by John Hibbs, second by Melody Fowler, that the property tax rate be increased by the adoption of a tax rate of \$1.36867, which is effectively a 6.66 percent increase in the tax rate.

Bowie Hogg shared that school finance is not easy and had we not seen an increase in property values and passed our 2014 bond, we would need an increase in the tax rate. Most people do not understand the two parts of the tax rate. Compared to other districts, we are usually fourth or fifth lowest. Mr. Hogg said he is looking forward to our work session on tax rates.

DISCUSSION:

A. Accountability Update

Dr. Cavazos reported that Dr. Barlow would be presenting a refresher on the accountability system with the Board and some preliminary results. He shared that the results were still be analyzed and that while this one state test is important, it does not represent the learning that students do all year. It is important that we remain focused on teaching and learning.

Executive Director of Research and Accountability Dr. Barlow shared a review of the information presented to the Board in June as well as updates regarding decisions made by the Texas Education Agency since that time. The A-F accountability system includes three domains that measure student achievement, school progress and closing gaps. For 2017-2018, districts receive a letter grade and campuses receive a *met* or *improvement required* rating. Dr. Barlow explained the scoring and matrix used for each domain. At the elementary and middle school levels the student achievement domain score is only based on the STAAR test. For high schools, the student achievement domain score is based on the STAAR test, graduation rates and college/career/military readiness. The school progress domain measures student growth and relative performance compared to other campuses

and districts. The closing the gaps domain compares the performance of each student group to a standard in each component area. Dr. Barlow also explained the scaling process used to determine district scores and campus scores. For 2018 the AISD overall score is 78, which is a letter grade of C. Through the summer, the district continued to receive revised rules, clarifications and updated data files from the Texas Education Agency. Under the previous accountability system and comparing 2018 scores to 2017 scores, AISD showed improvement in index one, three and four and remained the same in index two. Dr. Barlow shared that twenty-nine campuses received at least one distinction designation; eleven campuses received a distinction for reading/English language arts; thirteen campuses received distinctions for mathematics; twenty campuses received distinctions for science; eight campuses received distinctions for social studies (elementary schools do not have a social studies assessment); twelve campuses received distinctions for academic growth; eleven campuses received distinctions for closing the gaps; and nine campuses received distinctions for postsecondary readiness. Ditto Elementary and Gunn Junior High both received all possible distinctions.

Board members asked clarifying questions regarding college readiness scores, AVID, student mobility, military readiness data, the calculation for district overall rating, definition for approaches, meets and masters grade level, forced distribution levels and defining a strategy to improve in such a complex system. Board members noted a concern for the continued updates and changes from the state, confidence in the validity of information, and the importance of understanding the system in order to take action.

Moving forward, Board members discussed the need to assess all strategies to determine which are on a trajectory to improvement and which need to be changed. As we analyze the data, we need to confirm that the information accurately reflects student achievement and knowledge and take steps to ensure that no schools are at risk to be rated as improvement required.

OPEN FORUM FOR NON-AGENDA ITEMS: None

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT:

Dr. Cavazos reported that the district is in full swing getting ready for the start of a new year, and that it was officially kicked off with teachers new to the profession checking in on Monday, August 6, 2018 at the PDC for training. They were treated to an inspiring speech from Linh Nguyen, our visual arts coordinator, who spoke to them about molding and growing their students all while throwing clay on a pottery wheel. Experienced teachers that are new to the district reported last Wednesday, and all teachers were back on campus on Monday, August 13, 2018.

Dr. Cavazos was happy to be invited to the transportation department's annual in-service training last week. Several employees were honored during the gathering and special recognition was given to safety trainer Natalie Carter who has been accident free for 25 years. He thanked all of our transportation department employees who take care of our students and put safety first.

Friday, August 13, 2018 was a big day in the Arlington ISD as the AISD leadership definition was introduced. This definition was created and refined over the past year as part of our participation in The Holdsworth Center's leadership training, and Dr. Cavazos said he is excited to see it being put into play and inspiring our leaders who, in turn, inspire our students. The three main components of the leadership definition are passion for the work, commitment to personal growth and dedication to the team.

The rain on Saturday did not dampen spirits for the fourth annual AISD Back to School Kickoff. More than 7,500 backpacks were handed out and hundreds of students received immunizations, haircuts, and dental and vision screenings. AISD cosmetology students from the AISD Dan Dipert Career and Technical Center worked hard giving haircuts for all four hours. Dr. Cavazos thanked all of the great partners and hundreds of volunteers who help make this event as huge as it is.

Dr. Cavazos attended a brick dedication ceremony for the first graduating class at Arlington Collegiate High School. Each student has their name and Class of 2018 on a brick in an area in front of the campus near the flag poles. AISD is proud of these students and thankful that they were a part of the journey from the beginning for our first-ever early college high school class.

Today AISD had a Day of Service in lieu of convocation. More than one hundred non-campus employees ventured out to different campuses to do everything from moving books and bookshelves to putting up bulletin boards and laminating posters. Dr. Cavazos had a great morning helping Bowie High School physics teacher Mr. Davila create posters for his classroom and deliver supplies to fellow science teachers. He said he hoped all of our employees enjoyed getting to know employees from other parts of our district for Day of Service and thanked everyone for their hard work.

SCHOOL BOARD'S REPORT:

John Hibbs noted that over 8,500 employees in our district are all dedicated to our children and their success. Board members and staff all hold themselves accountable and Mr. Hibbs said he believes in our administration and our leadership. As evidenced tonight by the passion of our new administrators, he believes the district is headed in the right direction. He is a champion for this district and would compare AISD's top graduates against any other district. Mr. Hibbs announced that the Citizens Bond Oversight Committee provides an opportunity for the public to be engaged and involved in AISD. He encouraged interested citizens to apply online through Friday, September 7, 2018 at 4:00 p.m. The committee was established to provide transparency in the use of 2014 Bond proceeds.

Kecia Mays shared that as we move forward to Monday and welcome back to students, teachers, administrators, noting those in churches and communities have been praying, that everyone go out and catch a few football games. Stay involved in seeing all the good things. Ms. Mays wished her mom a happy birthday as she turns 88 years old. Mrs. Mays said she appreciated being taught high integrity and noted the importance of a pure heart, even if mistakes are made.

Bowie Hogg pointed out that there was something special about the Bowie High School quarterback, Mrs. Mays' son. He shared that in addition to putting up a Care Bear collection in prekindergarten, he also put together the PLC room at Hale Elementary School and moved some heavy filing cabinets. Mr. Hogg said he appreciated the day of service and staff, central office and warehouse, for the nice model to show that campuses are working every day for our students. He also noted that on Saturday we lost education advocate, Ms. Lisann Peters. Ms. Peters was a friend to AISD as she helped start the AWARE foundation, funded several reading oasis units, paid to send some fifth grade teachers to Williamsburg (his wife brought back information to share with students in classroom), and she never looked for recognition. He asked that everyone please keep the Peters family in their prayers.

Aaron Reich reported that he participated in the Chamber of Commerce panel on property tax. The room was packed and provided a wonderful opportunity to highlight what property tax is for school districts versus county or city. He said we would continue to share and educate regarding what is on the tax bill and what AISD actually gets. Dr. Reich thanked Mrs. Birdow and Mr. Perales for their amazing work at the Back-to-School bash. The coordination and support from the community is phenomenal. The notable story is that the AISD students from the Dan Dipert Career and Technical Center were the ones doing haircuts. Due to this addition, AISD increased capacity and provided a great experience and service learning opportunity for our kids. He also noted that the little kids looking up to big kids provides an opportunity. One five year old girl was there getting her very first haircut and this amazing opportunity was there because of the Back-to-School kickoff. Dr. Reich thanked all the teachers, staff, and schools engaged today in the day of service. He was at Swift Elementary and appreciated all the hard work our district staff and teachers do all the time. At the end of day was the 'sneak a peek' as everyone works and prepares he appreciates the amazing spirit. In 72 hours students are coming back to start the year. He thanked Dr. Cavazos for a great job and for having hit new heights in leadership and a positive environment/culture.

Board Secretary Kecia Mays had nothing to report this evening.

ADJOURNMENT:

President Reich adjourned the meeting at 9:49 p.m. The Board did not return to closed session.

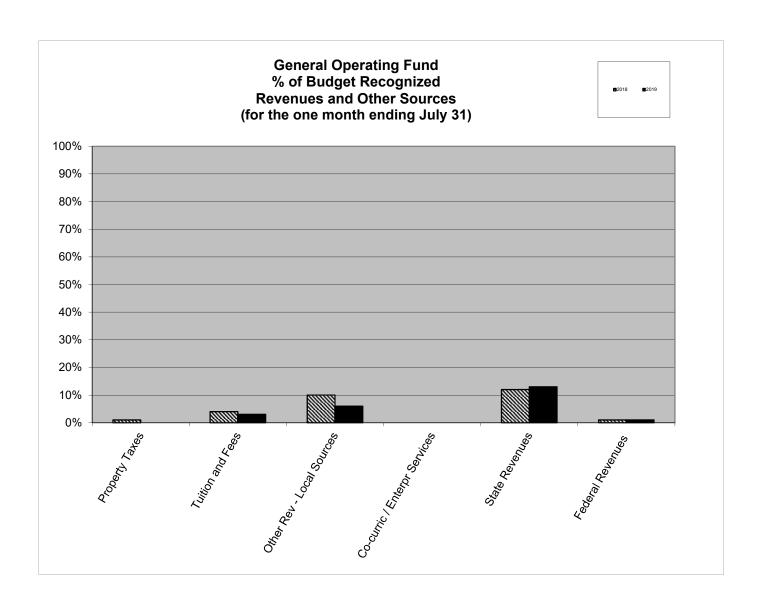

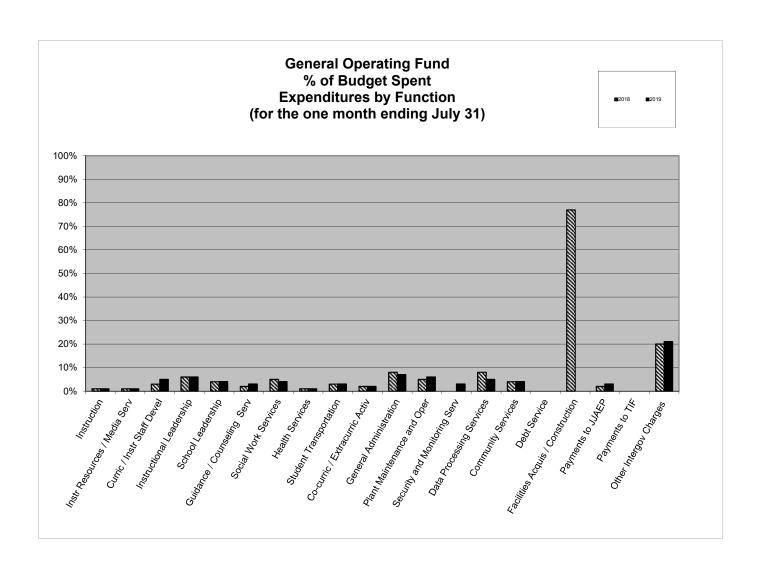

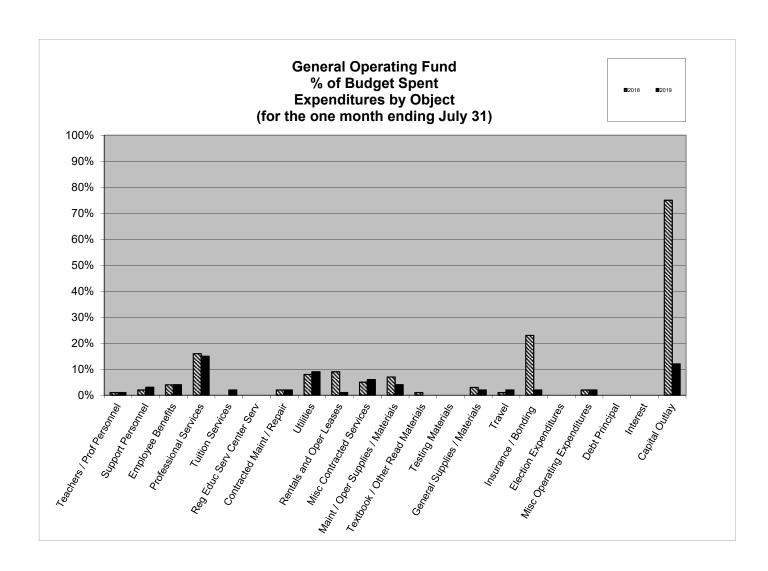

Year 2018-2019, Funded through the Office of the Governor, Criminal Justice

Division (CJD)

Purpose:

To give the Board of Trustees the opportunity to discuss and possibly act on a resolution to support the *AISD ELEVATE Project grant*.

Background:

The AISD submitted a grant proposal in the amount of \$53,833 to the North Central Texas Council of Governments (NCTCOG) and funded through the Office of the Governor, Criminal Justice Division. The project will be implemented through the Student Development and Support Services Department, with the goal to inspire at-risk 7th grade male students to achieve higher levels of attendance, academics, and citizenship.

Students at three junior high campuses (Bailey, Carter, and Gunn) will be provided with ongoing case management and curriculum designed to empower them with appropriate social and emotional skills to increase learning and achievement. The program will utilize ongoing case management, small peer groups, off-campus events during the school year and summer, and parent engagement activities designed to:

- Increase attendance.
- · Decrease the number of behavior/discipline referrals, and
- Increase course/testing performance and keep participants engaged in school.

The AISD ELEVATE Project will focus on the ABCs (Attendance, Behavior, and Course Performance) with identified participants during the 2018-19 school year to ensure that students are on track to complete junior high and ready to enter ninth grade equipped with the skills to succeed in school and postsecondary endeavors in college and career. The grant budget includes extra-duty hours for facilitators at Bailey, Carter, and Gunn to create curriculum, conduct orientation meetings and facilitate student events; as well as including other supportive services and materials.

CJD requires a signed resolution from the Board acknowledging submission of the proposal, designation of the AISD Authorized Official, and use of funds.
