Subject: Required Language in Board Minutes to Delegate Authority to Superintendent to Obligate the District under Texas Education Code Chapter 41

Purpose:

Per TEA regulation, prescribed language must appear in the Board minutes to effect the authority the Board delegated to the Superintendent on October 4, 2018, for obligating the District under Texas Education Code (TEC) Chapter41 for the 2018-19 school year. The Board must now take action to record the required language in the Board minutes.

Background:

At the regularly scheduled Board meeting on October 4, 2018, the Board consented to enter into an agreement with TEA to equalize the District's wealth level under TEC Chapter 41, and to allow the state to net recapture payments against regular state funding payments (under TEC Chapter 42) received throughout the year. The Board also consented to delegate authority to the Superintendent to obligate the District under Chapter 41 of the TEC, which is required in order to submit the Chapter 41 agreement electronically to TEA.

TEA requires the following specific, prescribed language to appear in the Board minutes to show that the Board delegated this authority to the Superintendent. A copy of the minutes must be included when the signed agreement is submitted through TEA's electronic reporting system (TEAL).

"For the 2018-19 school year, we delegated contractual authority to obligate the school district under Texas Education Code §11.1511(c)(4) to the superintendent, solely for the purpose of obligating the district under TEC, Chapter 41, Subchapters A and D, and the rules adopted by the commissioner of education as authorized under TEC, 41.006. This included approval of the *Agreement for the Purchase of Attendance Credits* or the *Agreement for the Purchase of Attendance Credits* (Netting Chapter 42 Funding)."

As communicated at the October 4 Board meeting, if a district's maintenance & operations tax rate is less than or equal to \$1.06, recapture under Chapter 41 does not apply. <u>Because AISD's maintenance</u> & operations tax rate is below \$1.06, recapture will not apply for the 2018-19 fiscal year. However, the District is still required to submit the Chapter 41 agreement to TEA.

Recommendation:

Administration recommends the Board of Trustees take action to record the prescribed language in the Board minutes to show the Board delegated authority to the Superintendent on October 4, 2018, to obligate the District under Chapter 41 of the TEC for the 2018-19 school year.

Purpose:

Consider the appointment of individuals to the School Health Advisory Council (SHAC) for the 18-19 school year.

Background:

The local School Health Advisory Council (SHAC), on behalf of the District, shall review and consider evidence-based strategies and techniques and shall develop nutrition guidelines and wellness criteria.

Board policy BDF LEGAL states that a board shall establish a local school health advisory council (SHAC) to assist a district in ensuring that local community values are reflected in the district's health education instruction. The SHAC shall meet at least four times each year.

The board shall appoint at least five members to the SHAC. A majority of the members must be parents of students enrolled in the district and must not be employed by the district. One of those members shall serve as chair or co-chair of the SHAC.

The board may also appoint one or more public school teachers, public school administrators, district students, health-care professionals, members of the business community, law enforcement representatives, senior citizens, clergy, representatives of nonprofit health organizations, representatives of local domestic violence programs, or representatives of another group.

The District posted an on-line SHAC application on the website and interested applicants completed the application for consideration. The Board Community Engagement Committee reviewed the applications and will recommend applicants for appointment to the SHAC. They will also recommend one of the members to serve as the committee chairperson.

Recommendation:

Administration recommends that the Board appoint individuals to the SHAC in accordance with the committee Charge and appoint one member to serve as the SHAC Chairperson.

Subject: Consider a Charge to a Capital Needs Steering Committee

Purpose:

To give the Board of Trustees the opportunity to discuss and possibly act on a charge to a Capital Needs Steering Committee

Background:

District personnel have engaged in long-range financial planning since fall 2017, including a capital needs assessment. Teachers, principals, department professionals, senior administrators and professional consultants have conducted a comprehensive assessment of capital needs focused on the following priorities to support the District's mission:

- Capacity for projected enrollment
- Learning spaces to support instructional programming
- Protect investment in existing facilities
- Current technology
- Increase access to programs
- Excellence for all students

On October 4, 2018, District Administration presented to the Board an overview of the capital needs assessment and findings derived from that assessment. Capital needs were identified in four broad categories: facilities, technology, fine arts and transportation.

The appropriate next step of the long-range planning process is to consider forming a Capital Needs Steering Committee ("Committee"). If approved by the Board, a Committee will review background information and results of the capital needs assessment, plan for community dialogues, help develop facilities options based on an educational framework created with community input, and recommend to the Board prioritized capital needs, including a facilities master plan. The Board will review the facilities master plan along with other identified capital needs and determine the method(s) of funding prioritized needs, including of a bond election.

Subject: The Meadows Foundation Grant

Purpose:

Establish the 2018-19 special revenue budget for the Meadows Foundation grant. Revenues and expenditures each total \$30,000. The grant period covers September 1, 2018 – August 31, 2019.

Background:

The District received notice that the award amount for the Meadows Foundation grant for 2018-19 is \$30,000.

The intent of this grant is to continue efforts, along with the Holdsworth Center, toward a digital database and tracking system to improve the deployment and retention of effective school leaders and teachers. The goal is to empower end-users to shape and inform the design of reports so that they are action-oriented. This will be accomplished through the use of a unified data system that will provide the foundation for data integration, data unification, and longitudinal data warehousing in support of Arlington ISD's near-term and long-term data-use goals.

Grant funds, along with funds from the Holdsworth Center and Arlington ISD budget funds, will be used to develop dashboards for a Human Capital management data system, map and load AISD data, system set-up and technical documentation, provide for travel expenses as well as technology licenses and hosting fees.
