Arlington Collegiate High School will:

- 1. Provide high-quality curriculum and instruction in a supportive and effective learning environment that enables the children served to meet the challenging States' academic standards as follows:
 - A. 100% of ACHS teachers will provide interventions and utilize regular tutorial sessions throughout the school day and outside of school hours to address specific areas of need for individual students.
 - B. Teachers will use study guides and software programs as a supplement to increase proficiency in areas of need.
 - C. Course success and completion for all ACHS LEP students will be monitored on a regular basis and communicated to students. Parents of LEP students will be continuously contacted to discuss areas of need.
 - D. Support for college classes will be provided through regularly scheduled tutorial sessions involving AISD and TCC staff. Tutorial Sessions could be during school day, after school, or on Saturday. Support will included the use of supplemental materials (workbooks, practice test, software, online supports), if available, to help students pass college courses.
 - E. The regular use of Khan Academy will be implemented in grades 9, 10, and 11.
