Welcome back! A lot of music has been releasedincluding Young Thug's 'Punk.' Young Thug is a role model and trailblazer in the music industry, and he continues to prove this with Punk. To start, I'm in love with the album cover. I probably stared at it for the first 4 songs and it captures the melodic, warm experimental tone of the album. The vocals and instrumentals dance with one another before fusing. Both are equally beautiful and complement each other well. There are a lot of features, but I



wouldn't take any of them out. Each artist does well to add to Young Thug's craft, my favorite being J.Cole, Doja Cat, Mac Miller, and Travis Scott. My favorite songs are

For this week's edition, I'll break down classes. Generally, science is the hardest class when you get to junior and senior year. The hardest part about Biology is not the vocabulary, labs, or lectures- it's the workload. Many students drown under the constant flow of work. This class gives you every type of homework there is. Realistically, it can be difficult to write full pages of good information, especially with the word requirements on some assignments.
