

CAMP FIRE EL TESORO DE LA VIDA

Camp Fire El Tesoro de la Vida is a overnight summer camp uniquely designed to support children who have experienced the death of a loved one.

Most adults have experienced loss and grief, but children do not always possess the necessary skills to cope with their loss effectively. El Tesoro de la Vida helps kids learn these skills alongside their peers.

The co-ed program consists of 90% traditional camping activities and 10% activities structured to help children through the natural grieving process. Licensed Professional Counselors (LPCs) lead small group sessions and are on-site the whole week to provide counseling and support.

Camp El Tesoro is a 223-acre camp in Granbury, Texas, nestled where Fall Creek meets the Brazos River. Campers live in modern cabins with two trained adult volunteers who are educated in the grieving process.

Camp Fire ensures any child who is grieving has access to camp through a scholarship program supported by the generosity of many individuals, foundations and organizations in the community. Be a donor at CampFireFW.org/donate

Due to the uniqueness of Camp Fire El Tesoro de la Vida each application is reviewed by a licensed professional counselor. It takes at least two weeks to process most applications. LPCs will begin making calls for family interviews in May. Acceptance will be based upon the LPC's interview and recommendation.
