



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# AISD Career & Technical Center





### **Districtwide Career & Technical Center**

- The CTC will serve students from all district high schools, offering courses in a wide variety of career and technical fields in a state-of-the-art learning environment
- 2101 Browning Drive, Arlington, TX 76010
- 169,800 square feet





### **About the CTC Center**

- High school juniors and seniors will remain enrolled in their home campuses and attend CTE courses at the Career Tech Center
- The CTC will be able to accommodate 4,800 students each A/B day cycle

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### Goals & Objectives

- Based on community input and labor market demands, there is a need for AISD students to graduate workforce ready
- Each student will earn:
  - A TCC Certification of Completion and/or;
  - An industry certification designed by business and industry and/or;
  - · A licensure from the State of Texas
- Support student's seamless entry into the workforce and/or post-secondary training



### **CTE Courses and Certifications**

- There will be 34 comprehensive programs of study for the 2017-2018 school year:
- First and second year foundational courses will be offered at each of the six comprehensive high schools
- Third and fourth year courses will be offered at the Career Tech Center and at the student's home campus
- The CTE Center and will offer 26 industry certifications





### **Learning Experiences**

- Center will be equipped with industry standard equipment in a 21<sup>st</sup> century learning environment
- Students will have the opportunity to enroll in workforce dual credit courses, take challenging industry exams, and earn licensure by state and national organizations
- On-the-job training could lead to future employment for seniors taking practicum courses

### **Course Selection Timeline**

- January 11 February 17
  - Current sophomores and juniors select courses for 2017-2018
- February 21 March 3
  - Course request data will be pulled from Career Cruising to determine number of student course requests for each course and the number of sections and staff needed to support requests
