From the Principal-Mr. Manley

Parents, I wanted to take the opportunity to share safety and security resources we have at Bowie in wake of the tragic events in Parkland, Florida on February 14, 2018.

At Bowie we conduct multiple drills each year as part of our safety and security systems that we have in place. We conduct the following drills during the course of the year: Fire Drills, Severe Weather Drills and Lockdown Drills.

Security systems are key to ensuring school safety for any campus. Having key personnel in those critical positions is also required. In last month's newsletter I shared information about our new Security Sergeant that we have at Bowie. Sergeant Kinlen has been doing a great job and reinforcing and strengthening our practices when appropriate.

I want to take a minute to share some information in regards to training that we have been conducting with our staff at Bowie. We have had training on Generation Z students and how they differ from previous generations and traits and qualities they pos-

You may ask what does this have to do with safety and security? Our focus and belief that the key to safety and security are the relationships that we form with our students, parents, neighbors, community businesses and each other as educators at Bowie. Strong, professional relationships are the key to students feeling involved and engaged at school.

I also ask you to be highly engaged with your student. How often do you discuss what is going on in their life and what they need assistance with. Young adults today live in a very fast-paced world that is constantly changing. They adapt very quickly and are able to adjust frequently to meet

the demands placed on them. Students of today need support and guidance from both home and school, and the benefit to the student is great when they experience both. Please be aware of your students actions on social media as we deal with issues arising on this platform on a daily basis. Please talk to your student about conflict resolution and who they can go to for assistance.

We have a great counseling staff at Bowie and they are ready to serve your student or you with any questions you have, or issues students need assistance with.

Our security staff is also very engaged with our students and are constantly monitoring our campus of 600,000 square feet. I have included information about our counselors and security in the newsletter this month. Please reach out to any of them for assistance and support if needed.

Thank you to the directors for leading a group that is so impactful on the community around us.








Academic All-State-Emily Anderson
