Students in Grades 3-6 will increase their Approaches performance level in math on STAAR from 60% to 68%.

Daily attendance will increase from 91.7% to 94%.

Focus Areas of Learning:

Our focus this year in Math is on fluency and problem solving, for reading is comprehension.

Because every student deserves the best education, together, we commit to the following:

- **Teachers will...**
 - Will model instruction and provide parents with reading materials and strategies by grade level during parent workshops, newsletters and class dojo.
 - Will share with parents, tips and resources on how to choose the right reading level book.
 - Will send home to parents one math application problem per week.
 - Will host grade level math and reading nights to share strategies with parents.
- **Parents can...**
 - Will practice with their children grade level reading strategies to improve fluency and vocabulary building.
 - Will read with their children daily.
 - Will use application problems and other strategies to help children make real world/ math concept connections.
 - Will practice math facts with their child.
 - Will attend parent workshops and academic nights to learn strategies to use at home.
- **Students can...**
 - Will keep a reading log of weekly readings.
 - Will read at least 20 minutes each day.
 - Will practice math facts for fluency (repetitive practice) using manipulatives or online resources
 - Will find ways of using math concepts at home.
