Sources of scholarship \$\$\$ for college –

- The *<u>College or University*</u> you plan to attend. Check their financial aid and scholarship link or call their financial aid and/or admissions office.
- High School Counselors and Teachers scholarship bulletins, school bulletin boards, HS Counselor web page
- High School <u>GO! Centers</u>, <u>Library</u>, Public Library or <u>bookstore</u> look for directories, talk to the staff, visit half price book stores to find more scholarship sources at reasonable prices.
- <u>Parent's employers</u> parent's workplaces sometimes offer scholarship money. Check it out.
- <u>Church, Synagogue or other religious organizations</u> talk to leaders at your place of worship.
- <u>Local, state and national businesses</u> research company websites, call the main number and ask about scholarship programs available. Recruit parents or friends to help with the research
- <u>Branches of the military</u> local recruiting offices can help you with this search. You may have to serve in some capacity in order to qualify but sometimes they might pay for college before you actually have to start your service.
- The <u>federal government</u> through the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) this form can be completed online after OCTOBER 1st of your senior year (NEW DATE) <u>www.fafsa.edu.gov</u>

Tips for a successful scholarship search:

- <u>Never pay</u> someone to search for scholarships for you the info is free and at your fingertips if you put in the time and effort.
- The information can be overwhelming <u>manage</u> it by setting aside time each week to focus on some aspect of your search and application.
- Many scholarships require <u>letters of recommendation</u> begin the process of obtaining letters from teachers, counselors, employers, pastors, etc. complete your Brag Sheet &/or Resume, give a copy to those you are asking for letters, give deadlines, give 2 weeks notice.
- Keep up with <u>DEADLINES</u> there is a reason they are called "Dead" lines.
- Many scholarships require an essay which may ask why you feel this scholarship should be awarded to you. Gather your thoughts, talk to friends and family members and enlist their help in <u>evaluating your strengths</u>.
- Get <u>ORGANIZED</u> Keep a notebook, folder or binder for scholarship info, letters of recommendation, unofficial transcript with gpa and class rank info.
