## Welcome to AP Biology!

In order to make sure we successfully learn all the information, some must be reviewed over the summer before school starts. I know it's a bummer to work over the summer, but I will be working to prepare for you and I expect the same effort on your part.

## Assignment:

- 1. Join the google classroom
  - a. Code: iai57yj
- 2. Read Chapters 1-5 of the Campbell biology text book. The text book is online in the google classroom.
- 3. Take notes over each chapter. I don't care what format you use for the notes, but they must include the chapter title on the first page, and then each section.
  - a. Example (Ch 1), your title would be Chapter 1: Themes in the Study of Life, and then write 1.1 and take notes over that section, skip a line, write 1.2 and take notes over that section, skip a line, write 1.3, etc. The notes should be written so I can easily see you completed the entire chapter. Each chapter should start on a new page of paper.
  - b. This can be completed in a spiral notebook or on loose notebook paper kept in a binder.
- 4. Complete the guided readings for chapters 1-5. Your answers for all the questions (except if it is a list of words to define) must be in **complete sentences**, or you will receive no credit. This is to help prepare you for the AP writing portion of the test.
- 5. Join the class remind

## Supplies:

- You will need to purchase a spiral notebook (3 subject or greater; highly recommend the plastic cover kind for durability) **OR** a 2 inch binder for this class only. If you choose to use a binder, you will need a pack of dividers.
- A prep book for the AP biology test. These books can be found on amazon for about 15-20\$ or at a local bookstore. Any are good, but I like CliffsNotes, Princeton Review, or Barron's.
