Food Donations

The Superintendent shall <u>be authorized to develop regulations for campuses to donate food in accordance with law.</u>

Meal Charges
State Law

As established byregarding the Board, a student with an exhausted or insufficient balance on his or heruse of a prepaid meal card or meal account shall be allowed to continue to purchase meals for up to at least two school days (two breakfasts and two lunches). The Superintendent shall develop administrative to purchase meals served at school. The regulations for this grace period to shall address:

- The <u>District's processes for parent notification</u> length of the grace period during the grace period which a student may continue to purchase meals with a meal card or account that is exhausted or insufficient; and
- 2.1. Parent notification in the event of an exhausted card or account, including a schedule for repayment; and-
- 1. Whether the student will be limited to certain foods or beverages during this grace period, and, if so, the District's efforts to minimize overt identification of the student. Alternate meals offered to a student with a negative meal account balance will meet federal guidelines for reimbursement under the National School Lunch Program

No fees or interest shall be charged by the District for in connection with meals purchased during the grace period.

Federal Law

For each campus that participates in the federal school breakfastwith an exhausted card or lunch programs under which students may incur a meal charge, the District's administrative regulations shall also address procedures for a student who has insufficient funds to purchase a meal following exhaustion of the grace period described above. The procedures shall address:

- 1. The parameters under which reimbursable or alternate meals shall be served to the student;
- 2. The District's efforts to minimize overt identification of the student; and

How the District will attempt to collect unpaid debt in order to maintain the financial integrity of the food service account.

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
