DISCUSSION:

A. Progress Report for Board of Trustees Continuing Education Credit

Pursuant to the Texas Education Code section 11.159, the minutes of the last regular meeting of the board of trustees held before an election of trustees must reflect whether each trustee has received the training required to be completed as of the date of the meeting.

President Reich announced that he has a report of the individual hours for all Trustees if anyone wanted to review and that all Trustees have completed and exceeded the required training hours. Dr. Reich reported that he had given each Trustee literature covering the *Framework for School Board Development* adopted by the Texas State Board of Education.

B. Gifted and Talented Program Update

Chief Academic Officer Dr. Steven Wurtz reported that for the college readiness portion of the strategic plan, the district had a strategy to redesign the gifted and talented program. In 2015, the district had 3,756 students identified for the gifted and talented program. That number has increased to 6,251 identified students for 2019. With a focus on the importance of early identification, the elementary level identified students for the gifted and talented program increased from 1,080 in 2015 to 3,780 elementary students in 2019. Dr. Wurtz highlighted the program work areas of student assessment, service design, curriculum and instruction, professional development, as well as family and community involvement. The next steps for the gifted and talented program include pullout and push-in for grades kindergarten through fifth grade, expanding advanced math enrichment pilot for fifth and sixth grades, program evaluation with subsequent action plan, and increased parent and community awareness. Development of a new five-year plan that includes further development of appropriate gifted and talented services for junior high and high school is planned for the 2020-2021 school year.

Board members asked clarification questions regarding the identification process after fourth grade, the nomination process, staffing levels, including the librarian in the program work, and assessments for transfer students. Board members thanked the team for the great work being done and noted that even if legislative action did not provide sufficient funds to support the program, the Board was committed to continue to support.

C. Legislative Update

Mrs. Powell provided the Board with an overview of the legislative timeline and shared key upcoming dates. May 27, 2019 is the last day of the 86th Legislative Session. The Arlington ISD legislative objectives relate to local authority, relevant instructional programs that reflect and complement the provisions of House Bill 5 (83rd Legislative Session), and suitable funding with relief from unfunded mandates. Mrs. Powell shared the status of various bills in the House and Senate related to academic accountability, school finance and property tax relief. Mrs. Powell reported that AISD

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worked with Representative Krause to file House Bill 2097, which was co-signed by all five AISD representatives and would authorize AISD to operate a pilot health care plan outside of the TRS system. The objective of the pilot is to lower the cost of health insurance and improve benefits for AISD employees. On April 4, 2019 Trustee Bowie Hogg, Superintendent Cavazos and Assistant Superintendent Scott Kahl testified in support of House Bill 2097 before the House Public Education Committee. Per the request of Committee Chair Huberty, representatives from AISD met with TRS officials on April 18, 2019. As a result of that meeting, TRS agreed to partner with AISD on a plan design separate from the existing ActiveCare plans as a pilot.

Board Governance Committee Chair Hogg cautioned that the Senate version of the school finance bill includes outcomes-based funding. He also noted that restrictions regarding how funds are spent and where raises can be applied, creates an unfunded mandate to provide salary increases for employees that are not teachers or nurses.

President Reich thanked the Board Governance Committee and staff for the 'huge lift' work done so far, for continuing to keep everyone updated and remaining active through the legislative session. He shared that he and other members of the Board would be ready for action if needed.

OPEN FORUM FOR NON-AGENDA ITEMS:

Dr. Reich announced that he received three Open Forum cards from people requesting to speak. He had been informed, however, that the cards were related to a grievance currently in process. As the grievance may at some point come before the AISD Board, they cannot hear concerns at this time. He stated that the documents shared with the Board would be returned to Mrs. Benjamin to maintain the integrity of the process.

Mrs. Benjamin, secretary to the Board of Trustees, returned the documents to the requestor.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT:

Dr. Cavazos reported that Sam Houston High School had eleven Texas Christian University Community Scholars honored in a surprise ceremony on campus last month. Each student receives \$260,000-plus, a full-ride scholarship, plus one semester abroad paid for by TCU. Sam Houston High School is one of thirteen area schools that participate in the Community Scholars program, and between 40 and 50 scholarships are awarded annually.

The Dan Dipert Career and Technical Center staff and the Parent and Community Engagement Department staff joined forces for a huge College and Career Expo that had both a college fair for high school juniors and seniors and also a career fair. More than 630 people attended and 54 colleges and 42 businesses participated.

The annual teacher job fair was March 30, 2019 and had a record numbers of attendees. More than 1,200 people registered for the job fair and over 800 attended. The feedback was great and everything ran very smoothly. Dr. Cavazos congratulated the human resources department on their work and shared that it took all of them to put on a job fair this big.

AISD teachers-of-the-year have been honored many times over the last couple of months. This month included the Kiwanis Luncheon and the districtwide teacher-of-the-year ceremony. Dr. Cavazos congratulated Melanie Caraway from Ashworth Elementary, Jocelyn Epley from Boles Junior High and Mariam Mohammad from Turning Point Secondary for being honored as Kiwanis Teachers-of-the-Year and to all AISD campus teachers-of-the-year for this well-deserved honor.

Superintendent Cavazos shared that the Parent and Community Engagement Department has been very busy this past month, hosting luncheons or dinners for fine arts stakeholders, business practicum leaders, and former and current board members. It is important to keep these groups informed and involved, and Dr. Cavazos appreciates the work it takes to prepare for and host all of these events.

The annual Education Foundation Education Celebration at Six Flags Over Texas was April 12, 2019. Many student groups performed and thousands of AISD families enjoyed a private party at Six Flags. The Education Foundation has raised more than \$1 million over the past six years through that event.

April 13, 2019 was the Family Expo and Summer Resource Fair hosted by PACE along with the Xi Theta Omega Chapter of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated, and the Arlington Foundation for Excellence in Education. This event was the largest it has ever been and provided many important resources for AISD families as they prepare for the summer. Dr. Cavazos reminded everyone that Father Fest was Saturday, April 25, 2019 at Bowie High School. The annual Entrepreneurship Day awards ceremony at UTA College Park Center was also on April 13, 2019. Hundreds of AISD

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students were recognized for their big ideas. Dr. Cavazos thanked the Arlington Chamber of Commerce and UTA for partnering with the AISD for such an inspiring event.

The second cohort of campus leaders to participate in The Holdsworth Center's leadership program was surprised last week. Teams from Atherton, Blanton, Burgin, Ellis, Miller and Peach elementaries as well as Bowie and Seguin high schools will begin this exciting and challenging program.

The Arlington ISD honored six of its campus leaders on April 17, 2019 with year-end awards. Dr. Cavazos congratulated the district's assistant principals, principals and dean of the year honorees: Elementary Assistant Principal of the Year is Ms. Gholston from Atherton Elementary, Secondary Assistant Principal of the Year is Ms. Nix from Bailey Junior High, Dean of the Year is Ms. Lundin from Seguin High School, Rookie Principal of the Year is Ms. Longoria from Hill Elementary, Elementary Principal of the Year is Dr. Lee from Peach Elementary and Secondary Principal of the Year is Mr. Benavides from Sam Houston High School.

Superintendent Cavazos shared that students always impress him at Media Fair, and this year was no different. The annual Media Fair was at the PDC, and he really enjoyed experiencing how AISD students learn and create through technology. He congratulated Elementary Best of Show winners Jayden R., Carlos M., Damien M. and Chelsea M. from Blanton Elementary and Secondary Best of Show winner Shelby L. from Sam Houston High School.

Dr. Cavazos recognized the March and April teachers of the month. In March, AISD honored Pamela Barnes from Ashworth Elementary, Tiffany Seaberry from Carter Junior High and Molly Haney from Martin High School. The April Teachers of the Month honored were Ashley Williams from Webb Elementary, Lori Green from Boles Junior High and Kathryn Beaver from Venture High School.

SCHOOL BOARD'S REPORT:

Mrs. Mays reported that she attended the ribbon cutting ceremony for the Arlington Life Shelter. She was very excited and shared that they assist many AISD students, allow families to stay together, and provide educational support. This provides the Arlington Life Shelter the opportunity to expand.

Dr. Reich reported that he, Mrs. Mays and Mrs. Walton attended the Holdsworth graduation event for Superintendent Cavazos and the senior team. The AISD team was one of the seven teams in the first cohort. The impact and footprint that this leadership training is leaving is wonderful and he was glad to be there and witness.

Secretary Mays reported that she had no items to consider.
