Subject: Resolution to Cast Votes for Tarrant Appraisal District Board of Directors

<u>Purpose</u>: To consider adoption of a resolution to cast the votes allotted to the Arlington ISD for the election of the Tarrant Appraisal District (TAD) Board of Directors.

<u>Background</u>: Each appraisal district is governed by a board of directors comprised of five directors elected by the taxing units that participate in the appraisal district. Members of the board of directors serve two-year terms beginning on January 1 of even-numbered years.

The current terms of service for the five members of the TAD Board of Directors will expire on December 31, 2019. Ten individuals have been nominated by the taxing entities served by TAD to fill these positions for the two-year term beginning January 1, 2020.

On October 3, 2019, the AISD Board of Trustees voted to nominate Mike O'Donnell as a candidate for the TAD Board of Directors for the two-year term beginning January 1, 2020. Mr. O'Donnell is an AISD resident and former school trustee. He has served as a director on the TAD Board of Directors since 2014.

In accordance with section 6.03(d) of the Texas Property Tax Code, the Chief Appraiser has computed the number of votes to which each eligible taxing unit is entitled to cast for the election of directors. AISD is entitled to 450 of the total 5,000 votes allotted to TAD taxing units. Votes must be cast in an open meeting by resolution and documented on the official ballot form provided by TAD. All votes may be cast for one candidate or distributed among any number of candidates. The completed ballot must be returned to TAD no later than December 15, 2019. The five candidates receiving the most votes are elected to the two-year term beginning January 1, 2020.

<u>Recommendation</u>: The Administration recommends that the Board of Trustees cast all 450 of AISD's votes for Mr. Mike O'Donnell for the Tarrant Appraisal District Board of Directors.

<u>Purpose</u>: To give the Board of Trustees the opportunity to consider and act on Change Order #1 amending the contract amount for 2014 Bond Construction Project for Young Junior High School, Ditto Elementary School, and 5618 Arkansas Lane Renovations Project, Phase V – Bid Package 5.

<u>Background</u>: As a part of the deficiency and life cycle improvements at Ditto ES, the General Contractor, Big Sky Construction (Big Sky), has incurred certain unforeseen costs which cannot be funded through the original, Board approved, construction contract. During the process of constructing the new parking area and tying in new building plumbing the contractor identified that the sanitary sewer and storm water piping serving the building was completely deteriorated and in need of total replacement. Big Sky and their mechanical subcontractor have provided a plan and pricing to remedy the deficiency. Big Sky has submitted Change Order #1 for the Ditto ES renovation project in the amount of \$464,512.46. This change order is comprised of four main items summarized in the table below.

In addition to the cost impact of addressing the unforeseen plumbing issues, there is a need to allow Big Sky additional time to complete the project. The CSP agreement, approved by the Board of Trustees on February 7, 2019, provided for a substantial completion date of August 1, 2019. As such, Big Sky has requested an additional 152 days from the original substantial completion date to complete the project. Big Sky has submitted Change Order #1 to amend the contract amount and a corresponding Notice of Claim to amend the substantial completion date to December 31, 2019

LBL Architects (LBL), the project architect, has reviewed the change order and validated the costs with Big Sky and AISD staff.

Mr. Horn,

There have been several unforeseen existing conditions and owner's requests replacement of exterior and crawl space sanitary and storm sewer lines, and subsequent fees for bonding, insurance, and contractor overhead to the school renovation project which are indicated below. Funds from the Construction Contingency Allowance have been set aside for critical items to keep the contractor working, however the fund is insufficient to cover all the costs for the required modifications and changes.

We have reviewed the contractor's revised cost proposal dated 10-25-19 for the required work and it is acceptable. The change order increases the Original Contract Amount contract amount by \$464,512.46 to a new contract amount of \$6,961,512.46 and adds 152 days to the Substantial Completion date from August 1, 2019 to December 31, 2019.

The five Items to be addressed in the Change Order are:

- 01- Replacement of exterior sanitary and storm sewer line changes necessary to address unforeseen deteriorated conditions in the amount of \$65,284.06.
- 02- Replacement of crawl space sanitary and storm sewer line changes necessary to address unforeseen deteriorated conditions in the amount of \$315,000.00.
- 03- Owner controlled contingency allowance in the amount of \$42,000.00.
- 04- Fees for Bonding, Insurance and Contractor Overhead in the amount of \$42,228.40. This consists of Overhead, Profit, Insurance and Bond totaling 10% of the PCO costs.

Mr. Horn,

Big Sky Construction is submitting this letter to Arlington ISD requesting a change order in the amount of \$464,512.46 and a time extension of 152 calendar days, extending the date of Substantial Completion to December 31, 2019, for added work resulting from unforeseen conditions found on the project. The items included in the change order are as follows:

- 1. Replacement of sanitary sewer and storm water drainage lines under the new parking area due to unforeseen deteriorated lines in the amount of \$65,284.06.
- 2. Replacement of sanitary sewer and storm water drainage lines in the crawlspace under the school due to unforeseen pipe deterioration in the amount of \$315,000.00.
- Owner controlled contingency allowance in the amount of \$42,000.00.
- 4. Fees for bonding, insurance and contractor overhead totaling 10% of the costs in the amount of \$42,228.40

Detailed proposals for the added scopes, including subcontractor pricing, have been provided and reviewed by LBL Architects and AISD Project Managers.

Subject: Consider 2020 Interim Legislative Agenda	

<u>Purpose</u>: To provide the Board with the opportunity to discuss an interim legislative agenda for 2020.

<u>Background</u>: The AISD Board of Trustees and administration actively work to educate the District's legislators on issues that impact AISD stakeholders. A legislative agenda is approved by the Board of Trustees in advance of each legislative session to set forth the District's position on key issues, and these agendas are the basis of our education advocacy with legislators.

During interim periods between legislative sessions, legislators hold committee hearings on interim charges assigned by the Lt. Governor and the House Speaker in preparation for the upcoming legislative session. Legislators also prepare bills to be filed for consideration in the upcoming session.

The 87<sup>th</sup> Texas Legislature will convene into session on January 12, 2021. The interim period between the 86<sup>th</sup> and 87<sup>th</sup> Legislatures will run through the 2020 calendar year.

The Administration has drafted a 2020 Interim Legislative Agenda to set forth the District's position on current key issues that impact AISD's academic accountability, school safety and security, finances, school choice and pre-kindergarten education. A copy of the draft 2020 Interim Legislative Agenda is attached hereto. Input was provided on the draft agenda by the Board Governance Committee. Upon Board approval of the 2020 Interim Legislative Agenda by the full Board, the Administration and Board of Trustees will actively engage and educate the District's legislators on issues set forth in the legislative agenda so they will be prepared to address the issues during legislative committee meetings held during the 2020 interim period and as they prepare for the 87th Legislative Session.

The Administration will present a draft interim legislative agenda for the Board's discussion.

# 2020 Interim Legislative Agenda Topics

# 2020 Interim Legislative Priorities:

- Monitor the Texas Education Agency's implementation of HB 3 to ensure it aligns with legislative intent and make adjustments as necessary
- Study and recommend solutions to sustain HB 3 provisions, including revenue sources to continue buying down school district M&O tax rates
- Track and report the correlation of poverty to state accountability ratings assigned to campuses and school districts
- Expand opportunities for districts to earn College Career Military Readiness (CCMR) outcomes points for accountability ratings, and align the CCMR outcomes bonus to the CCMR point system
- Study and recommend effective legislative solutions and appropriate ongoing funding for threat assessments and identification, services and supports for students with mental health needs
- Monitor work of TRS to develop regional, consumer-based healthcare plans to ensure that affordable options are offered to school district employees through TRS-Active Care by the start of the 2020-21 plan year

Accountability: An effective, efficient and equitable state academic accountability system is necessary to carry out the mission and objectives of the Texas public education system. Texas' current academic accountability system provides confusing information to parents about the performance of their child's school and is too complex for school districts to navigate effectively. The state accountability system should be a tool that helps local school boards and educators improve student performance. The Texas Legislature should:

- Leave the authority to address low performing schools with the locally elected board
  of trustees. Local authority still depends on state standard academic measures;
  however, it allows the local board of trustees to determine the best response to the
  results of those state measures
- 2. Remove the high-stakes SSI retention provision for students assessed in grades 5 & 8
- 3. Modify accountability rules to include non-test based indicators in addition to STAAR results for calculating elementary and junior high school ratings
- 4. Make the provisions for individual graduation committees permanent

- 5. Monitor implementation of the A-F rating system and make adjustments to the system as appropriate
  - Track and report the correlation of poverty on campus and district accountability ratings
  - Expand opportunities for districts to earn College Career Military Readiness outcomes points
- 6. Eliminate Public Education Grant (PEG) designations

# Mental Health and School Safety: Public safety is a priority for the Arlington ISD. The Texas Legislature should:

- 1. Work with school districts to create a platform that identifies students with mental health needs that pose a threat to public safety
- 2. Provide appropriate ongoing funding for identification, services and supports for students with mental health needs
- 3. Provide appropriate funding and assistance for threat assessments
- 4. Allow school districts flexibility to determine how safety and mental health funds are spent in order to best meet local needs

School Finance: Legislation and an appropriation that provides funding for public education to fully meet the mission and objectives described in Texas Education Code, Section 4.001 and the 60x30TX higher education plan impact three areas critical to public education – student achievement, qualified education workforce and local control. The Texas Legislature should:

### Student Achievement:

- 1. Monitor the Texas Education Agency's implementation of HB 3 to ensure it aligns with legislative intent. Make adjustments as necessary
- 2. To prepare students to make informed choices for high school coursework and endorsement plans for their college and career choices, expand the courses eligible for weighted career and technical education in grades 6 8 to include certain courses that are not used for high school graduation credit
- 3. Align criteria for the CCMR outcomes bonus to the CCMR point system in the Accountability system
- 4. Reject legislation that imposes financial responsibility or penalty on school districts to cure the state's prior policy limiting the identification of students for special education services

#### Tax Relief:

- 1. Identify state revenue sources to sustain the finance system authorized through HB 3
- 2. Provide tax relief to property owners and assist school districts in providing relevant learning environments by fully funding the \$40 guaranteed yield per student for Existing Debt Allotment and Instructional Facilities Allotment set forth in HB 21 passed by the First Called Session of the 85th Legislature

### Qualified Workforce:

1. Allow school districts discretion to include librarians, counselors and nurses with more

- than five years of experience in differentiated compensation increases approved for classroom teachers with more than five years of experience
- Increase access to affordable health insurance for public school employees. Monitor
  work of TRS to develop regional, consumer-based healthcare plans to ensure that
  affordable options are offered to school district employees through TRS-Active Care
  by the start of the 2020-21 plan year

## Local Authority:

- Monitor administrative rules created by the Texas Education Agency to ensure alignment with legislative intent, and limit the authority of the appointed Texas Education Commissioner to unilaterally establish administrative rules, guidelines and procedures
- 2. Reject legislation that expands required ballot language, mandates November election dates or requires a super majority for school bond and tax rate elections
- Provide flexibility to invest surplus oil and gas royalties in accordance with the Texas
   Trust Code, similar to the provisions included in HB 1472 passed by the 85th
   Legislature
- 4. Provide relief from current unfunded state mandates and do not add additional unfunded mandates

# School Choice: The Arlington ISD is a district that offers choice for students and parents. The Texas Legislature should:

- 1. Reject any legislation that diverts public funds to private institutions that are not accountable to the public for the use of those funds
- 2. Incentivize school districts to provide program choices by fully funding transportation costs for choice programs
- 3. Expand flexibilities available through the district of innovation regulations
- 4. Require more transparency and accountability for existing charters
- 5. Limit the expansion of charter schools

# Pre-kindergarten: Access to quality pre-K positively impacts academic readiness and performance. The Texas Legislature should:

- 1. Fund universal full-day Pre-K
- 2. Fund Pre-k through ADA rather than the early education allotment
