



Elementary-Age Group Therapy: Games + Fun with a CBT, Trauma-Informed Approach to empower children to identify their feelings, handle stressful situations using healthy coping skills, and learn how to discern safe adults to approach for help. Middle School to High School Age Group Therapy: Includes the above elementary-age groups, but with a higher emphasis on conflict resolution, healthy peer relationships, bullying, and reacting to peer pressure.



#### **Dental Health Arlington**

501 W. Sanford Suite 11 Arlington, TX 76011

We provide access to dental care for low-income residents of Tarrant County. Our services are very similar to what you would find in a private dental practice at a fraction of the cost. Patients must qualify as low-income by providing proof of residency, proof of income with pay stubs or of government assistance, and a valid photo ID. There is a \$45 fee for the initial appointment. The patient is given a treatment plan and options for payment

arrangement. This is all done in the DHA Dental Clinic located in the Arlington Human Services Center on Sanford Street. The SMILES (Sealing Molars

Improves the Lives of Every Student) Program is our secondary program that provides no cost, preventive dental services to AISD students in Title 1 Schools. We provide dental screenings, oral hygiene instruction, nutritional counseling, and give them a toothbrush. If they are healthy, we place decay-preventing sealants and fluoride on their teeth.

We send information home to parents if they are in need of dental services and refer them back to their dental home. If they do not have a dental home and they have no insurance, they can be referred to the DHA Dental Clinic for low-cost treatments. If they are in severe pain or have severe infection impeding their learning, we offer that emergency service for free until they can get to their dentist. This program is currently available for all Title I First through Fourth graders identified through AISD.







Programming involves group therapy 5 hours/day, 5 days per week, and can serve as a midground option for clients stepping down from inpatient care.

Intensive Outpatient Programming (IOP): A step-down level of care for clients to transition back to work or school, this program provides structure and support while clients practice enhanced coping skills. It includes 3 hours per day/5 days per week.

In addition, it includes individual therapy and family/couples therapy, as needed. When in IOP, clients see the psychiatrist a minimum of once per week.

Medication Management: Clients are evaluated and monitored by a psychiatrist for medications, adverse reactions, and side effects to reduce their current mental health symptoms. This service is available as a maintenance option or in conjunction with outpatient therapy appointments.
