

2021 Legislative Session: What Must Now Go On Your Website

- A statement listing any curriculum materials in the public domain used for the district's human sexuality instruction and the link to where these materials are located
- The 72-hour notice before any school health advisory council meeting
 - The minutes and video/audio recording of said meeting no later than 10 days after the meeting
- The employment policy of the district, and the full text of any regulations referenced in the policy
 - Also make available any forms referenced on an intranet website or give the district administrative office information
- If the school board chooses to adopt TEA's new guidelines for use of digital devices, you must post this guidance (This doesn't come into effect until the 2023-2024 school year)
- If the district will allow transportation to students who live outside the district, you must post your compliance with TEC s34.007(a)(3) in its entirety.
- If you hold an election, you must post after the election:
 - The results of each election
 - The total number of votes cast
 - The total number of votes cast for each candidate or for or against each measure
 - The total number of votes cast by personal appearance on election day
 - The total number of votes cast by personal appearance or by mail during the early voting period
 - The total number of counted and uncounted provisional ballots cast
- If you're holding an election, than no later than 21 days before the election you must post:
 - The date of the election
 - Location of each polling place
 - Each candidate for an elected office on the ballot
 - Each measure on the ballot
